Splash Pad Scheduled to Open June 6

Earlier this year the opening of the Splash Pad was questionable, but thanks to the Township maintenance crew, it is scheduled to open June 6. The daily hours will be 12noon-7pm thru Labor Day unless a health or safety concern arises or if the pad is being misused

All posted rules must be followed to include no running or horseplay. It is a wet surface, so use caution. Rubber soled water shoes are needed to ensure safety on and around the Pad. Please note that water balloons are not permitted on the pad as they clog the drains. Paper, plastic wrapper and other trash will clog drains as well. Trash should be placed in the receptacle. Adults must supervise children.

The pad is activated by movement around the yellow post and the Splash Pad Building. First visitors who arrive may have to wait 10 minutes or so until the pumps are warmed up and ready to go.

Summertime Advice for Drivers

School is out and the long days of summer are here! When driving in neighborhoods and country roads drivers need to be cautious as children can be unpredictable and hard to see.

Here are some tips to help keep kids safe:

Slow down. Drivers should be alert to children near residential areas. Avoid distractions and have a watchful eye for moving children!

Use extra caution at intersections and crosswalks. Be prepared to stop or yield to pedestrians even if they are not at designated crossing areas since children may not always follow traffic rules.

Be mindful of parked cars and hidden driveways. Children may be running around parked vehicles and may be difficult to

In driveways, check carefully around your vehicle prior to **moving.** Move slowly in driveways. Be mindful of blind spots. Keep an eye out for bicycles and scooters. Children can be erratic and may need additional safe distance around them.

Grass clippings can cause unsafe conditions on the road. Justin Lovely, Motorcycle injury lawyer and President-elect of The National Academy of Motorcycle Injury states, "Grass clippings on the road essentially place an additional layer between the bike tire and the road. It is almost like an oil slick."

Residents are asked to keep clippings in their yard. Per Ordinance 6-97, grass clippings are

prohibited from being placed on Township roads.

Not Acceptable Items: stumps, bamboo, ornamental grasses, grass clippings, rose bushes, flowers & bulbs, vines, roots of any kind, garbage, bulk items, dirt, stones, bricks, construction debris, concrete, hazardous materials, charcoal, fruits and/or vegetables, bags or containers.

Eco-Friendly Tips for Summer

Wash your car at a carwash.

Most car washes reuse the wash water before sending it to a treatment plant. If you want to wash your car at home, wash it on gravel or grass. **Start composting.**

Pre-made compost tumblers are a great opportunity for a small yard. Not only does the composting reduce waste, but adding compost to your soil helps with stormwater infiltration.

Only rain should go down storm drains.

Make sure not to blow grass clippings into storm drains, and if hosing off your driveway or car, try to send the runoff into a vegetated area.

Set sprinklers to minimize runoff. Make sure sprinkler heads are ad-

justed to reduce overspray and only water the minimum amount necessary for the plant.
